Recipe of the month from Eleanor DeBassio: 1 cup chopped cranberries 1 cup sugar. Mix these two together and let sit 1/4 cup shortening. 2 cups flour 3/4 cup orange juice. 1 1/2 tsp baking powder 1 egg. 1 tsp salt 1 tsp vanilla. 1/2 tsp baking soda 1/2 cup nuts (if desired) Mix dry ingredients together. Mix shortening,egg,vanilla and orange juice together. Stir in cranberries and nuts. Bake at 325 degrees for approximately one hour in a lightly greased bread pan.
