#### VETERANS' DAY - 2013

The Framingham Elks have served in all branches of the military, in many capacities, and all over the world. We have had veterans in all of the nation's wars from the Civil War to now. Many were not Elks when they served, but became members later. For example, in 1924, the Lodge initiated 20 Civil War veterans, members of the Grand Army of the Republic and records show that on past Veterans' Days, the Lodge had it's Spanish-American War veterans participate in the town's Veterans' Day parade, although none of those veterans are identified by name. There were many, many beside those below who stepped up to serve our country. It was my privilege to have known each of the members mentioned here.

Of the 50 Lodge members who served in World War I. PER **Gardner Hannon** had the singular distinction of serving in the Navy in both WWI and World War II. **Bill Casey's** naval service was spent in the submarines. **Joe McManus** also served in the Navy in WWII. His destroyer, the U.S.S. Bush, was sunk by kamikazies near Okinawa; the ship that picked up the Bush survivors was also sunk. Joe later said that he didn't think it was personal on the part of the Japanese, but he was never positive. Another of our members, former Inner Guard **John O'Connell** had a somewhat different view. John survived the Bataan Death March and spent the rest of the war in a Japanese prisoner-of-war camp. In later years, John wasn't too warm to any product known to be "Made In Japan."

PER Aldo Grandoni also spent time as a POW. He was a waist gunner whose bomber was shot down over Romania. The rest of his war was spend as a guest of the Germans. Bernie MacKenzie's bomber that also had bad luck. After Bernie finished all of his flight training, he was sent to England. His bomber crashed taking off on his very first mission. Bernie was busted up pretty good, but fortunately he survived. Another member had much better luck; John Jackson was the youngest bomber pilot in WWII to complete twenty-five missions. He, along with Bob (Sam) Higgins who served as a bombardier in Europe, never talked much about their experiences during the war.

**Jack McManus** fought in the Battle of the Bulge. He said that he could hear the clank of German armor as it moved past him in the fog and dark. He said he was never as cold and scared as he was in those days in the Hurtgen Forest.

When the Korean War broke out, members from all branches of the service stepped forward: the Marines **"Shag" Moreau**, the Army's **Dwight Wigglesworth**, the Navy's **Jimmy LeBlanc** were among those who served and saw action.

The numerous Lodge members who served their country during the Cold War, and the hot wars of Vietnam, the Gulf War, and Afghanistan are also remembered and are honored for their service.

November 11 is the day set aside to remember our Veterans. But anyone who had to leave his family, put his life on hold, and make costly physical and mental sacrifices

to protect our freedoms deserves to be thanked, honored, and respected every day of every year.
