GRAND LODGE ENF SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship season has started with the Elks Most Valuable Student scholarship, now open for seniors in high school. Applications are only available on line at ENF website at www.elks.org/enf/scholars. The ENF MVS awards range from \$4,000 to \$50,000 so well worth applying for. DEADLINE IS 11/27/2017

ENF also offers **Legacy awards** for seniors in high school for children and grandchildren of Elks members. (Elks Members Only). These are also \$4,000 awards. The application process is done completely online, <u>www.elks.org/enf</u> with a deadline of 1/29/16. **DEADLINE IS 2/02/2018**

A third ENF program is the **Emergency Educational Grant Program**. This is open to students of deceased or totally disabled Elks members. Please contact the scholarship chairman for an application. New and renewal applications should be filed **between May 1** and October 31.
