A Committee has been formed to review our Lodge By-Laws as is required every five years.

One item which will be voted upon at our October 17. 2012 meeting is:



Article VI-A: Exemplification of Rituals: Sec.1 The Officers of the Lodge are authorized to use alternative forms of the opening, closing and initiatory Rituals as approved by the Grand Lodge.

An affirmative vote would allow the Officers to use an abbreviated form of the rituals. This does not mean that they must use it. The traditional rituals may also be used.

Other changes will be presented in future bulletins to be voted upon at a later time.
